Example interview samples with different scenarios

Scenario 1:

Candidate Mr Anderson acknowledges the importance of appropriate boundaries and safeguarding

Scenario 2:

Candidate Mr Roberts offers a troubling perspective on adults and children relationships while answering the same questions
